*Your natural waist and the smallest part of your torso don't always sit in the same place. Your natural waist is where your body folds when you bend side to side. The smallest waist sometimes (not always) sits sit an inch or so above the natural waist. All measurements should be relative to your natural waist, so you have the best fit and mobility.

**The Iliac Crest is the top of the pelvic bone, sometimes seen as protruding hip bones on slender people.

**Measure from your natural waist to your armhole. It should end an inch or two lower than your actual armpit for comfort, and is where the top of the corset will sit on corsets with tight armholes. Select a height which will be comfortable with your arm down.

Please have someone else help you measure, to ensure the most accurate measurements possible. All measurements should be taken in inches.

If you are ordering a made to order corset, the corset will be made to the size that will best fit you. The size will be chosen based on your Bust, Underbust, Waist, Iliac Crest and Hips.
